## 1. Getting started

- a. Determine your musical period, style, composer, and selection preferences.
- b. Find a concert within your budget, location, and time preference.

#### 2. Pre-concert research

- a. The specific performing organization as well as its genre
- b. The performing venue and suitability
- c. The performance program
  - i. Specific compositions
  - ii. Specific composers
  - iii. Specific periods of music covered
- d. Cost
  - i. Special student rates, etc.
- e. Familiarize yourself
  - i. The internet is a great resource to listen to some/all of the programmed compositions.
  - ii. Don't forget about our text as a resource!

#### 3. At the concert

- a. Read the program notes for ideas and cues
- b. Note the size of the performing organization, special instrumentation, etc. (this may vary from piece to piece in the program)
- c. Note your general impressions, memorable events, etc.

### 4. After the concert

- a. Reflect/discuss what you heard with others.
- b. If possible, read reviews of the performance by professional critics (remember, you have the right to agree or disagree with them based on your understanding of music and art)!
- 5. Write the essay (remember: 1-2 pages typed)
  - a. Be sure to list the date, location, and organization in your essay.
  - b. Provide a very brief background of all or some of the performance pieces.
  - c. Describe in detail, using your acquired knowledge (terminology, etc.), what you heard, felt, etc. while attending, favorite moments/pieces, etc. This should be the main body of your essay.
  - d. Evaluate the performance based on your observations and reactions. Did you enjoy the experience?
