General Listening Tips!

Address some/all of the issues below, in ANY order. Start with the "Rule of Three" (A, Z, or in between):

1. Instrumentation/Ensembles

- a. Large (Full)/Small (Chamber)
- b. Orchestra/Band/Specific Instrument
 - i. Strings
 - ii. Woodwinds
 - iii. Brass
 - iv. Percussion (Non-pitched/Pitched)
- c. Keyboard (Piano/Organ/Harpsichord)
- d. Voices (Chorus/Choir)
 - i. Accompanied/Acapella
 - ii. Language (Latin, etc.)

2. Style

- a. Type of Piece (Chant, Organum, Motet, Mass, Chanson, Madrigal, Aria, Opera, Cantata, Oratorio, Suite, Symphony, Concerto, Sonata, String Quartet, Piano Piece, Art Song, Cycle, Tone Poem, Ballet, etc.)
- b. Approximate Period/Century
- c. (Composer, Title, Date)

3. Description/Analysis

- a. Texture(s)
 - i. Monophonic, Homophonic, Polyphonic
- b. Harmonic Materials
 - i. Tonal
 - 1. Major/Minor
 - 2. Modal
 - 3. Chromatic
 - 4. Other (Pentatonic, Whole Tone, Blues Scale)
 - ii. Atonal/Serial
 - iii. Dissonant/Consonant
 - iv. Thick/Thin Harmony
 - v. Simple/Complex Harmony
 - vi. Block/Apeggiated Harmony
- c. Rhythm

 - i. Imitation, Sequence, Ostinato, Repetition, Antiphonal Choirs, Text Painting, Sprechstimme, etc.
 - ii. Motivic Material Description (Knocking/Fate Motive, Rocket Theme, Idee Fixe, Leitmotive, etc.)
 - iii. Folk/National Influences
